Please stand for the Call to Worship, if you are able.

L: But we have this treasure in jars of clay, to show that the surpassing power belongs to God and not to us.

P: We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair;

L: Persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed;

P: always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be manifested in our bodies.

A Light Shines


