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# SUNDAY

## GOD CALLS

### Psalm 105:1-11, 43-45 [ESV]

Emphasis added: [read the whole Psalm here](#)

Oh give thanks to the LORD; call upon his name;  
    ***make known*** his deeds among the peoples!  
Sing to him, sing praises to him;  
    tell of all his wondrous works!  
Glory in his holy name;  
    let the hearts of those who seek the LORD rejoice!  
Seek the LORD and his strength;  
    ***seek his presence*** continually!  
Remember the wondrous works that he has done,  
    his miracles, and the judgments he uttered,  
O offspring of Abraham, his servant,  
    children of Jacob, his chosen ones!

He is the LORD our God;

# MONDAY

## GOD CALLS

### **Psalm 56:1-7** [ESV]

*To the choirmaster: according to The Dove on Far-off Terebinths. A Miktam of David, when the Philistines seized him in Gath.*

Be gracious to me, O God, for man tramples on me;  
all day long an attacker oppresses me;  
my enemies trample on me all day long,  
for many attack me proudly.

### **Confession**

# WEDNESDAY

*"Ash Wednesday" (February 17, 2021) is the liturgical name for the first day in the season of Lent. Historically, Christians have used these 40 days to pray in fasting, silence, and service as they remember their mortality and their need for salvation. While City Reformed does not use ashes in worship, the symbol reminds us that "we are dust" and the LORD remembers those who fear him. Consider how you might also pray through embodied practices in the coming weeks.*

## **Psalm 103** [ESV]

# FRIDAY

*Silence does not always mean the absence of noise. Silence can also mean avoiding speech or showing respect through postures of humility. In this liturgy, "silence" means not suppressing your thoughts before they develop. This is done by 1) listening to whatever "pops into your mind" and 2) offering them to God without filter. Instead of trying to direct your prayers, simply observe what your heart and mind are doing and invite Jesus into them.*

## GOD CALLS

- Don't rush. Set a timer for 1-2 minutes if you need to.

*To the choirmaster: according to Jeduthun. A Psalm of David.*

For God alone my soul waits in silence;

### **Confession**

Specifically confess those things that you were ashamed of in your silence. Confess your unspoken, sinful, nature.

### **Assurance of Pardon from Psalm 62:11-12**

Once God has spoken;  
twice have I heard this:  
that power belongs to God,  
and that to you, O Lord, belongs steadfast love.  
For you will render to a man  
according to his work.

# SATURDAY

*This liturgy is designed to go with a meal that celebrates God's work in creation. Consider who you might safely share a meal with. If you have the resources, thankfully celebrate your bounty with good food, drink to make the heart glad, and comforts to make your face shine.*

## GOD CALLS

### **Prepare your Meal**

- As you plan and prepare your meal, pray the beginning of **Psalm 104:1-23** [ESV], knowing that the beauty of creation is magnified as you cultivate and partake of it with thankfulness and humility.

Bless the LORD, O my soul!

O LORD my God, you are very great!

You are clothed with splendor and majesty,  
covering yourself with light as with a garment,  
stretching out the heavens like a tent.

He lays the beams of his chambers on the waters;  
he makes the clouds his chariot;

he rides on the wings of the wind;  
he makes his messengers winds,  
his ministers a flaming fire.

He set the earth on its foundations,  
so that it should never be moved.

You covered it with the deep as with a garment;  
the waters stood above the mountains.

At your rebuke they fled;  
at the sound of your thunder they took to flight.

The mountains rose, the valleys sank down  
to the place that you appointed for them.

You set a boundary that they may not pass,  
so that they might not again cover the earth.

You make springs gush forth in the valleys;  
    they flow between the hills;  
they give drink to every beast of the field;  
    the wild donkeys quench their thirst.  
Beside them the birds of the heavens dwell;  
    they sing among the branches.  
From your lofty abode you water the mountains;  
    the earth is satisfied with the fruit of your work.

You cause the grass to grow for the livestock  
    and plants for man to cultivate,  
that he may bring forth food from the earth  
    and wine to gladden the heart of man,  
oil to make his face shine  
    and bread to strengthen man's heart.

The trees of the LORD are watered abundantly,  
    the cedars of Lebanon that he planted.  
In them the birds build their nests;  
    the stork has her home in the fir trees.  
The high mountains are for the wild goats;  
    the rocks are a refuge for the rock badgers.

He made the moon to mark the seasons;  
    the sun knows its time for setting.  
You make darkness, and it is night,  
    when all the beasts of the forest creep about.  
The young lions roar for their prey,  
    seeking their food from God.  
When the sun rises, they steal away  
    and lie down in their dens.  
Man goes out to his work  
    and to his labor until the evening.

**Begin Your Meal**

- Before you start eating, continue reading **Psalm 104:24-30** [ESV]

O LORD, how manifold are your works!  
In wisdom have you made them all;  
the earth is full of your creatures.  
Here is the sea, great and wide,  
which teems with creatures innumerable,  
living things both small and great.  
There go the ships,  
and Leviathan, which you formed to play in it.

These all look to you,  
to give them their food in due season.  
When you give it to them, they gather it up;  
when you open your hand, they are filled with good  
things.  
When you hide your face, they are dismayed;  
when you take away their breath, they die  
and return to their dust.  
When you send forth your Spirit, they are created,  
and you renew the face of the ground.

**Grace for the meal**

Gracious and bountiful God, we give you praise for all of your works and the vastness of your creation. We, along with everything living, look to you for our food and provision. We thank you for this meal so graciously prepared and so freely given. May it renew us, just as your Spirit renews all of creation. Amen.

- After you are done eating, read the end of **Psalm 104:31-35** [ESV] and read the assigned chapters.
