Call to Confession: Hebrews 4:12-13

For the word of God is living and active, sharper than any twoedged sword, piercing to the division of soul and of spirit, of joints and of marrow, and discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart. And no creature is hidden from his sight, but all are naked and exposed to the eyes of him to whom we must give account.

Prayer of Confession: (Prayer of St. Augustine, 397 A.D.)

Great are you, O Lord, and greatly to be praised; great is your power, and infinite is your wisdom. And man desires to praise you, for he is a part of your creation; he bears his mortality about with him and carries the evidence of his sin and the proof that you resist the proud. Still he desires to praise you, this man who is only a small part of thy creation. You have prompted him, that he should delight to praise you, for you have made us for yourself and restless is our heart until it comes to rest in you.

Who will bring me to rest in you? Who will send you into my heart so to overwhelm it that my sins will be blotted out and I may embrace you, my only good? Tell me, by your mercy, O Lord, my God, what you are to me. Say to my soul, "I am your salvation." I will hasten after that voice, and I will lay hold of you. Hide not your face from me. Even if I die, let me see your face lest I die.

The house of my soul is too narrow for you to come into me; let it be enlarged by you. It is in ruins; you must restore it. There is much about it which must offend your eyes; I confess and know it. But who will cleanse it? To whom shall I cry but to you? I do not contend in judgement with you, who are truth itself; and I would not deceive myself, lest my iniquity lie even to itself. I do not, therefore, contend in judgement with you, for if you, Lord, would mark iniquities, who could stand?

Sermon: Luke 8:4-19
"The Heart of the Reformation: The Word of God"

And when a great crowd was gathering and people from town after town came to him, he said in a parable, 5"A sower went out to sow his seed. And as he sowed, some fell along the path and was trampled underfoot, and the birds of the air devoured it. 6And some fell on the rock, and as it grew up, it withered away, because it had no moisture. 7And some fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up with it and choked it. 8And some fell into good soil and grew and yielded a hundredfold." As he said these things, he called out, "He who has ears to hear, let him hear."

⁹And when his disciples asked him what this parable meant, ¹⁰he said, "To you it has been given to know the secrets of the kingdom of God, but for others they are in parables, so that 'seeing they may not see, and hearing they may not understand.' ¹¹Now the parable is this: The seed is the word of God. ¹²The ones along the path are those who have heard; then the devil comes and takes away the word from their hearts, so that they may not believe and be saved. ¹³And the ones on the rock are those who, when they hear the word, receive it with joy. But these have no root; they believe for

a while, and in time of testing fall away. ¹⁴And as for what fell among the thorns, they are those who hear, but as they go on their way they are choked by the cares and riches and pleasures of life, and their fruit does not mature. ¹⁵As for that in the good soil, they are those who, hearing the word, hold it fast in an honest and good heart, and bear fruit with patience.

¹⁶"No one after lighting a lamp covers it with a jar or puts it under a bed, but puts it on a stand, so that those who enter may see the light. ¹⁷For nothing is hidden that will not be made manifest, nor is anything secret that will not be known and come to light. ¹⁸Take care then how you hear, for to the one who has, more will be given, and from the one who has not, even what he thinks that he has will be taken away."

¹⁹Then his mother and his brother came to him, but they could not reach him because of the crowd.

Deuteronomy 6:6-7/ And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise.

Matthew 4:4, 6:18-19/ But he answered, "It is written, "'Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God.'" that your fasting may not be seen by others but by your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you. Lay Up Treasures in Heaven "Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal...

Mark 7:9-13, 12:24/ And he said to them, "You have a fine way of rejecting the commandment of God in order to establish your tradition! For Moses said, 'Honor your father and your mother'; and, 'Whoever reviles father or mother must surely die.' But you say, 'If a man tells his father or his mother, "Whatever you would have gained from me is Corban" (that is,

given to God)— then you no longer permit him to do anything for his father or mother, thus making void the word of God by your tradition that you have handed down. And many such things you do." ... Jesus said to them, "Is this not the reason you are wrong, because you know neither the Scriptures nor the power of God?"

John 10:36/ ...do you say of him whom the Father consecrated and sent into the world, 'You are blaspheming,' because I said, 'I am the Son of God'?

Eph 2:19-20/ So then you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God, built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Christ Jesus himself being the cornerstone.

2 Peter 3:15-16/ And count the patience of our Lord as salvation, just as our beloved brother Paul also wrote to you according to the wisdom given him, as he does in all his letters when he speaks in them of these matters. There are some things in them that are hard to understand, which the ignorant and unstable twist to their own destruction, as they do the other Scriptures.

Scriptural Response: Westminster Larger Catechism

Q. 155. How is the Word made effectual to salvation?

A. The Spirit of God makes the reading, but especially the preaching, of the Word an effectual means of enlightening, convincing, and humbling sinners; of driving them out of themselves and drawing them to Christ; of conforming them to his image and subduing them to his will; of strengthening them against temptations and corruptions; of building them up in grace; and of establishing their hearts in holiness and comfort through faith to salvation.
