We want heaven NOW, and struggle with anger and bitterness when your good providence calls for waiting, suffering or tribulation. We frantically rush to fix our problems and escape discomfort rather than guiet our hearts in trust before you. Forgive us, Father. Lord Jesus, you waited patiently upon your Father's timing and work in your humanity. You have been

patient for us; now be patient with us and help us to grow into people who put their hope in you and your Word and wait for you more than watchmen for the morning. Help us to wait in submission for the fullness of our salvation, and to celebrate joyfully in the tokens of that salvation that you give us every day. Amen
