"Sometimes the level of need around the world is so overwhelming, it is difficult to believe that the body of Christ has incredible potential to meet many of these needs in Jesus' name. As described in our research, church member giving is declining as a portion of income, and was 2.17% in 2016. If Americans who identify with the historically Christian church had chosen to give 10% to their congregations in 2016, rather than the 2.17% given that year, there would have been an additional \$172 billion available for work through the church."

## Sermon:

**Malachi 3:1-12**

**"But is the Tithe for Today?"**

- Elder Dave Snoke

**B**ehold, I send my messenger, and he will prepare the way before me. And the LORD whom you seek will suddenly come to his temple; and the messenger of the covenant in whom you delight, behold, he is coming, says the LORD of hosts. <sup>2</sup>But who can endure the day of his coming, and who can stand when he appears? For he is like a refiner's fire and like fullers' soap. <sup>3</sup>He will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver, and he will purify the sons of Levi and refine them like gold and silver, and they will bring offerings in righteousness to the LORD. <sup>4</sup>Then the offering of Judah and Jerusalem will be pleasing to the LORD as in the days of old and as in former years.

<sup>5</sup>"Then I will draw near to you for judgment. I will be a swift witness against the sorcerers, against the adulterers, against those who swear falsely, against those who oppress the hired worker in his wages, the widow and the fatherless, against those who thrust aside the sojourner, and do not fear me, says the LORD of hosts.

<sup>6</sup>"For I the LORD do not change; therefore you, O children of Jacob, are not consumed. <sup>7</sup>From the days of your fathers you have turned aside from my statutes and have not kept them. Return to me, and I will return to you, says the LORD of hosts. But you say, 'How shall we return?' <sup>8</sup>Will man rob God? Yet you are robbing me. But you say, 'How have we robbed you?' In your tithes and contributions. <sup>9</sup>You are cursed with a curse,

for you are robbing me, the whole nation of you. <sup>10</sup>Bring the full tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. And thereby put me to the test, says the LORD of hosts, if I will not open the windows of heaven for you and pour down for you a blessing until there is no more need. <sup>11</sup>I will rebuke the devourer for you, so that it will not destroy the fruits of your soil, and your vine in the field shall not fail to bear, says the LORD of hosts. <sup>12</sup>Then all nations will call you blessed, for you will be a land of delight, says the LORD of hosts.

## Sermon Outline

- I. The context of Malachi 3
  - The Messiah will confront and challenge
  - The scholar class actually made the Law easier to obey by reducing it to legalism
  - We can often do this ourselves, to try to justify ourselves
- II. The specific case of the tithe
  - Used for priests (worship) and helping the poor
  - Jesus does not overturn this principle, but expands it, to a lifestyle of great generosity
  - The New Testament church practiced radical generosity
- III. The spirit of the tithe is blessing to the whole community
  - The "prosperity Gospel" errs by taking an individualistic approach, which is ultimately for selfish gain
  - God does want to pour out blessing
- IV. Specific questions
  - If you are in financial crisis, let the church help you
  - We have a huge degree of freedom to decide what is "prudent"
  - The local church should be our main avenue for giving, as it involves corporate wisdom
  - A good start is to treat others to parties and meals!
