Sermon Outline

Proposition: The man who waits, laments, the man who laments, obeys, and the man who obeys, God forgives (covenants).

Fallen condition: When faced with difficulty, we often turn away from God, rather than run towards him.

Main Points: There are three main themes in Psalm 25...

- 1. Waiting (What is godly waiting?)
- 2. Lamenting (What is godly lamenting?)
- 3. Relationship and forgiveness (Why covenant is so important?)

Conclusion: Jesus obedient, Jesus lamenting, Jesus forgiving... all for you.

Creedal Response: Westminster Larger Catechism
