Pastoral Prayer

Sermon: Matthew 11:1-15

When Jesus had finished instructing his twelve disciples, he went on from there to teach and preach in their cities.

⁷As they went away, Jesus began to speak to the crowds concerning John: "What did you go out into the wilderness to see? A reed shaken by the wind? ⁸What then did you go out to see? A man dressed in soft clothing? Behold, those who wear soft clothing are in kings' houses. ⁹What then did you go out to see? A prophet? Yes, I tell you, and more than a prophet. ¹⁰This is he of whom it is written, "Behold, I send my messenger before your face, who will prepare your way before you." ¹¹Truly, I say to you, among those born of women there has arisen no one greater than John the Baptist. Yet the one who is least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he. ¹²From the days of John the Baptist until now the kingdom of heaven has suffered violence, and the violent take it by force. ¹³For all the Prophets and the Law prophesied until John, ¹⁴and if you are willing to accept it, he is Elijah who is to come. ¹⁵He who has ears to hear, let him hear."

Additional Scripture

Creedal Response: Westminster Confession of Faith 18.4

In the meantime, they are supported by the Spirit from utter despair.

Outdoor, socially distanced, **in-person** service will be held twice, with **communion** (pre-packaged individual cups) served both times.

- If able to attend either time, last names **A-J attend 5:00PM & K-Z the 6:00PM.**
- **** BRING YOUR MASKS **** Mandatory mask policy for everyone over 2 years old.
No childcare provided.
- Bring your own **chairs** or blankets to sit on.
- **Park on the street** or along the campus driveways parallel to Ellsworth, Bayard & Morewood. *Do NOT park in the parking lot NOR adjacent to the field.* **Handicap** spots will be reserved near the Ellsworth entry and Bayard exit.
- **Walk to the courtyard parking lot for the service from Ellsworth Ave or Bayard St, by the field.**
- No entry to the service through the building, only exit from the service through the building.
- **No fellowship hour** - please **exit soon after Benediction.**
- Stop by the **check-in table** (by the field) to pick up a **bulletin.** Note that for purposes of **contact tracing**, we are **checking in everyone** who attends. Consider downloading the **Church Center app** to check yourself in for the service in advance on your Android or iOS smartphone. Scan the QR code for the app.
- If you have an **infectious disease**, do not attend until you are fever-free for 72 hours, 10 days have passed since your symptoms first appeared, and other symptoms (cough, shortness of breath, etc) have improved.
- Members who are **highly vulnerable** should give special attention to their participation with any in-person activity.
- Members who have had **close contact with a COVID** positive person should follow guidelines for quarantine.
- Members who have **traveled out of state to a high risk** area should attend to government recommendations for reentry.
