*Please stand for the Call to Worship if you are able.*

Leader That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we looked upon and have touched with our hands, concerning the word of life—

People **The life was made manifest, and we have seen it, and testify to it and proclaim to you the eternal life, which was with the Father and was made manifest to us—**

Leader That which we have seen and heard we proclaim also to you, so that you too may have fellowship with us;

People **And indeed our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son Jesus Christ.**

Leader And we are writing these things so that our joy may be complete.

People **This is the message we have heard from him and proclaim to you, that God is light, and in him is no darkness at all.**

## **Call to Confession: 1 John 1:6-10**

If we say we have fellowship with him while we walk in darkness, we lie and do not practice the truth. But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin. If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. If we say we have not sinned, we make him a liar, and his word is not in us.

## **Prayer of Confession**

Father, your holiness is the purity of light. You call us to know the truth and practice the truth. But we confess that we have failed. We have walked in darkness. We cannot say that we have not sinned, or we would be lying. We have sinned in our thoughts, in our words and our deeds. We have not loved you with all of our hearts and we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves.

We look to the blood of Jesus to cleanse us from our sin. Teach us to walk in your light. Teach us to be faithful and just as you are faithful and just. Help us to find true fellowship with one another. Amen.

## **Sermon: Philippians 2:1-11**

**2019 Core Values: Formed by the Cross**

**"True Community and the Way of the Cross" - Reverend Matt Koerber**

**S**o if there is any encouragement in Christ, any comfort from love, any participation in the Spirit, any affection and sympathy, <sup>2</sup>complete my joy by being of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind. <sup>3</sup>Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves. <sup>4</sup>Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others. <sup>5</sup>Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, <sup>6</sup>who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, <sup>7</sup>but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. <sup>8</sup>And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. <sup>9</sup>Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, <sup>10</sup>so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, <sup>11</sup>and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

## Creedal Response: Westminster Shorter Catechism

Q27. What did Christ's humiliation consist of?

**A. Christ's humiliation consisted of his being born in a low condition, living under the Law, undergoing the miseries of this life, undergoing the wrath of God and the cursed death of the Cross, and in being buried and continuing under the power of death for a time.**

Q28. What does Christ's exaltation consist of?

**A. Christ's exaltation consists of his rising again from the dead on the third day, ascending to heaven, sitting at the right hand of God the Father, and coming to judge the world on the last day.**
