# **Call to Worship:** Romans 8:28-35, 37 Please stand for the Call to Worship if you are able.

- And we know that for those who love God all things work Leader together for good, for those who are called according to his purpose.
- For those whom he foreknew he also predestined to be People conformed to the image of his Son, in order that he might be the firstborn among many brothers.

Then King David went in and sat before the LORD and said, "Who am I, O LORD God, and what is my house, that you have brought me thus far? <sup>17</sup>And this was a small thing in your eyes, O God. You have also spoken of your servant's house for a great while to come, and have shown me future generations, O LORD God! <sup>18</sup>And what more can David say to you for honoring your servant? For you know your servant. <sup>19</sup>For your servant's sake, O LORD, and according to your own heart, you have done all this greatness, in making known all these great things. <sup>20</sup>There is none like you, O LORD, and there is no God besides you, according to all that we have heard with our ears. <sup>21</sup>And who is like your people Israel, the one nation on earth whom God went to redeem to be his people, making for yourself a name for great and awesome things, in driving out nations before your people whom you redeemed from Egypt? <sup>22</sup>And you made your people Israel to be your people forever, and you, O LORD, became their God. <sup>23</sup>And now, O LORD, let the word that you have spoken concerning your servant and concerning his house be established forever, and do as you have spoken, <sup>24</sup>and your name will be established and magnified forever, saying, 'The LORD of hosts, the God of Israel, is Israel's God,' and the house of your servant David will be established before you. <sup>25</sup>For you, my God, have revealed to your servant that you will build a house for him. Therefore your servant has found courage to pray before you. <sup>26</sup>And now, O LORD,
